LEGISLATIVE

Tricare for Life Users Surprised by Drug Cost Increase. *Military.com* tells us, "Over the last few weeks, I have heard from many Tricare for Life beneficiaries caught off guard by the recent increase to pharmacy costs, including a change that moved drugs that had been completely free to a charge of \$7 for a 90-day supply. Drug prices increased Feb 1 for all Tricare users, including retirees over 65 on Tricare for Life.

A 90-day supply of generic drugs received through the system's Express Scripts mail-order pharmacy went from free to \$7. Co-pays on brand-name drugs received through the mail went from \$20 to \$24 and from \$49 to \$53 for non-formulary drugs.

For prescriptions filled at retail pharmacies, a 30-day supply for generic drugs increased from \$10 to \$11, while brand-name drugs went from \$24 to \$28; non-formulary drugs went from \$49 to \$53.

Drugs filled at a military treatment facility continue to be free.

Drug costs typically increase slightly every Feb 1, but the increase from free to \$7 for generics received by mail came as a surprise for many users on TRICARE For Life according to feedback I've received by email. Many users had read that changes to TRICARE happening Jan 1st didn't really impact them. So what caused the confusion? Too many changes at once.

TRICARE For Life users really are not impacted by the big changes to TRICARE that hit Jan 1 beyond this minor calendar shift that most users won't even notice.

What was poorly communicated, perhaps, was that the pharmacy increases were completely separate from the Jan 1 updates. Like all pharmacy cost changes in years past, those updates do impact TRICARE For Life users."

CHAPTER HISTORY

"Reflections"

AMERICA'S MOST BELOVED VETERANS

A few years ago, I read an article in an American Legion Magazine that listed the results of a survey listing the top 100 choices of America's Most Beloved Veterans. More than 70,000 votes were cast. The choices span our nation's lifetime. Following are the top ten choices and a few brief facts about their time of glory.

- 1. <u>AUDIE MURPHY</u>: The most decorated American Veteran of World War II, receiving every Military Combat award for valor available from the U.S. Army, as well as French & Belgian awards for heroism. He received the Medal of Honor for valor at the age of 19. Other awards received included the Distinguished Service Cross, Silver Star (2), Legion of Merit Bronze Star (2) and the Purple Heart.
- 2. <u>GEORGE WASHINGTON</u>: As first President, he is celebrated as the Father of his Country. He forged the Continental Army into a well-trained force of professionals and is recognized as the true father of the U.S Army.
- 3. <u>THEODORE ROOSEVELT</u>: He is remembered for his heroic battlefield performance in Cuba in 1898 and leading his "Rough Riders" in driving the well-armed Spanish forces from the San Juan Heights during the Spanish American War.
- 4. **ALVIN YORK**: Awarded the Medal of Honor for his heroic accomplishments in 1918 during World War I in the Forest of Argonne.
- 5. **GEORGE PATTON**: One of America's most popular military figures during World War II, he was a winner who knew how to convince his soldiers that they were winners also. After the war, many German generals claimed he was the best Allied general.
- 6. **<u>DWIGHT EISENHOWER</u>**: The supreme commander of the World War II Allied Expeditionary Force landing in Normandy on June 6, 1944, on the eve of the greatest military endeavor in history.
- 7. **NORMAN SCHWARZKOPF**: When anyone thinks of Desert Storm, they think of Stormin' Norman, the Bear, the Commander. He was a larger-than-life figure who, by his performance, his articulateness and his brilliant strategy, lit up the world.
- 8. **ROBERT E. LEE**: A brilliant General, who served with distinction in the Mexican War, then served as superintendent of West Point. During the Civil War, in loyalty to his home state of Virginia, he commanded the Confederate Army of Northern Virginia.
- 9. **JIMMY DOOLITTLE**: He is most known for his planning and execution of the famed April 18, 1942, bombing raid against Tokyo, Japan, that bears his name. He went on to command the 12th, 15th and 8th Air Forces.
- 10. <u>ULYSSES S. GRANT</u>: Best known as the Northern General who won the Civil War, he earned the gratitude of millions who believed he was both the General who saved the Union and the President who made sure that it stayed together.

Below is a recipe to accompany those wonderful barbecues you'll be enjoying with family and friends.

Creamy Cucumber Salad

2 long English cucumbers
1/2 cup plain Greek yogurt (or sour cream)
3 tablespoons lite Mayonnaise
1/4 cup fresh dill, chopped
3 tablespoons white vinegar
1/2 teaspoon sugar
1/3 cup sliced white onion (OPTIONAL)
Salt to taste

Peel the cucumbers and cut in half lengthwise. Scrape out the seeds and slice into 1/4" slices.

Combine all dressing ingredients and toss with cucumbers.

Refrigerate 1 hour before serving.
