LEGISLATIVE

At the time of this writing, the only meaningful pieces of legislation currently being debated in Congress are the American Healthcare Act of 2017 and the President's FY 2018 federal budget proposal. I have received many questions about the American Healthcare Act specific to what it means for our families and those on TRICARE. I can assure you that there is no reason for concern, whatsoever, because the language in the bill makes it clear that the provisions of the bill have impact on current federally provided healthcare systems such as Military Treatment Facilities. Medicare. TRICARE Healthcare. So until the bill clears the Senate and enters committee to work out the differences in the two bills, there is really nothing to worry We will continue to monitor the about. legislation as it works its way through the Senate and we will keep you all informed if any changes come to light that would concern our members.

The President's budget marks a rapid departure from the past six years where the Department of Defense was asked to shoulder 50% of budget under sequestration since Sequestration forced the services to personnel, cut back on training and forgo required maintenance and recapitalization of combat systems after 16 straight years of constant deployment. The President's budget proposal calls for the complete repeal of sequestration and the restoration of \$52 billion to the Department of Defense. If Congress approves this measure, it would mean the personnel cuts that have made it so hard on our current active duty members would stop. That, in itself, is something worth fighting for!

This budget doesn't give us everything we want, but it is a much better foundation to build upon than last year's budget proposal. It is important to remember that the President's budget proposal is just that, a proposal, and now the real work begins in Congress to work out the details. We will demand that our active duty Airmen get the full pay raise according to the law and will fight any efforts to increase out-of-pocket costs for healthcare for our Airmen, both past and present. We will keep an eye on that process and let you all know if we need you to jump in and make your voices heard. It looks like we have turned the page on the never-ending cuts to the DoD budget, so let's hope that Congress does its job and puts America First!



CHAPTER HISTORY "Reflections"

This History article is about Richards-Gebaur AFB 50 years ago and what was going on in the summer of 1967. For those who remember, let me refresh your memory. For those who do not remember or were not yet born, just follow along. To set the tone of 1967, Lyndon Johnson was the President of the United States.

The war in Vietnam dominated the everyday news. In Kansas City sports, the Chiefs played in the first ever Super Bowl on January 15th and lost to the Green Bay Packers, 35-10. The Kansas City baseball team was the Athletics who had a very losing record that year and left for Oakland over the winter.

Richards-Gebaur was an Air Defense Command Base in 1967 with the 328th Fighter Wing serving as the host unit. HO CENTRAL NORAD REGION TENTH AIR FORCE was located in Building 100, at the first intersection inside of the main gate, with Major General Thomas K. McGehee as the Commander. At the end of 1966, the last of the F-102 Delta Daggers of the 326th FIS had left the base and were replaced by the newer F-106 Delta Dart aircraft of the 71st Fighter Interceptor Squadron commanded by Lieutenant Colonel Ellis Stanley. Also located on Richards-Gebaur was the AFRES 442nd Military Airlift Wing flying the C-124 Globemaster Aircraft and commanded by Brigadier General Ben Mangina. The Base Commander was Colonel Jim Wood.

During the spring and summer of 1967, we, in the F-106 business, completed a major modification to the aircraft that allowed the aircraft to be refueled in flight. The 71st became the first F-106 unit in the Air Force to become in-flight refueling qualified in the summer of 1967. It also became the first F-106 unit to complete training in Aerial Combat Tactics. In December 1967, the 71st FIS became the first F-106 unit to be fully qualified for worldwide duty and the first F-106 unit to deploy outside of the United States using in-flight refueling.

For those in the AFRES 442nd who remember 1967, you will recall that in June of that year, a 442nd C-124 made a "gearup" landing two miles south of the Whiteman AFB runway. The six crew members escaped unharmed, but the aircraft was destroyed by fire.

I hope you enjoyed a look back to 50 years ago at Richards-Gebaur AFB, especially those who were stationed there at that time, and what a wonderful base it was to be a part of where so many memories were made. Take care and have a great summer!

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

Hope everyone is doing well these days. Summer is here and so is the humidity – yuck! Charlie and I spent a week with our best friends in Arizona and I so loved the weather. High heat, yes, but little humidity. You could actually walk outside and not get blasted!! I find that really zaps my energy! As much as I would love to move to Arizona for my health (had no asthma problems), my family is here and that's where I need to be – for now!

Onto the recipes – I found a couple of extremely easy recipes with less than five ingredients. Enjoy!

Italian Meatball and Biscuit Bake

22-oz. package frozen cooked Italian meatballs

16.3-oz. can Pillsbury Grands Refrigerated Buttermilk Bisquits

14-oz. jar tomato pasta sauce

1-1/2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese

Heat oven to 375°F. Spray a 13x9-inch (3-quart) glass baking dish with nonstick cooking spray.

Place meatballs in large microwave-safe bowl. Microwave on MEDIUM for 3 to 5 minutes or until meatballs are thawed.

Separate dough into 8 biscuits. Cut each biscuit into 8 pieces; place in large bowl with meatballs. Add pasta sauce; toss to coat. Spoon and spread mixture in sprayed baking dish.

Bake at 375°F for 30 to 40 minutes or until edges are deep golden brown and biscuit pieces are no longer doughy. Sprinkle with cheese; bake an additional 2 to 5 minutes or until cheese is melted. Let stand 10 minutes before serving.

Serves 12.

Quick & Tasty Banana Pudding

1 small banana

- 3 tablespoons thawed nondairy whipped topping (Cool Whip)
- 2 tablespoons prepared vanilla pudding (use any brand snack pack pudding and measure out 2 tablespoons)
- 2 vanilla wafers

Cut half of 1 small banana into slices; keep other half in the peel and save for another use. Layer 1 (5-oz.) glass with 1 tablespoon. thawed nondairy whipped topping, one-fourth of banana slices, 1 tablespoon vanilla pudding, another fourth of banana slices, and 1 vanilla wafer. Repeat. Dollop with 1 tablespoon. thawed nondairy whipped topping.

Serves 1.
